The following description is taken from Chin-Shan Chang's original notes:

"This amusing and entertaining Taiwanese Folk dance and song show the grasshopper teasing the rooster. This is reflected in the sudden jerking forward and backward, and the slight bending of the knees. The dancing style, called Chu Ku Nung is over 300 years old, from the region of Fukien, a province in the SE part of China where many Taiwanese originated. Influenced by local geography and living conditions this style has become a prototype for new dances in Taiwan"
