Su Balitto

(Italy, Sardinia)

From the territory of Nuoro in Sardinia, Su Balitto is a dance done in all the north of the island. The name means "the little dance."

Pronunciation: SOO bah-LEET-toh

Music: 6/8 meter CD: Danze Italiane Vol. 1, Band 16 ("Su Falcittu")

Formation: Closed circle for any number of people. Stand facing into the center, close to each

other, hands joined, forearms parallel to the floor. There is a designated leader that calls the step changes. Change is indicated by the leader yelling "AYE-OH."

Meas Music: 6/8 meter Pattern

free <u>INTRODUCTION</u> No action. Dance begins at will.

I. TRAVELING STEP

Step sdwd on L to L (ct 1); step on R next to L (ct 2); step sdwd on L to L (ct 3); small

bounce on L (ct 4); step on R to R (ct 5); small bounce on R (ct 6).

This step can be done sdwd L, fwd, and bkwd.

II. STEPPING IN PLACE

Same ftwk as Traveling Step but done in place with the free ft floating slightly fwd on

cts 3 and 5, almost becoming a small kick.

Variation: individuals and couples may break away from the circle and dance in the center, using the same ftwk, moving fwd, bkwd, and sdwd improvisationally.
