Tsnka means knee, Par means dance. Literally a "knee dance." It is a traditional dance from Musaler, a region in former West Armenia, present Anatolia (Turkey). Taught by Liudvig Poghosian (dance tour to Armenia, May 2007).

Pronunciation: tsunk pahr

Music: Barev-Armenian Dances, Band 12. 4/4 meter

Formation: Closed circle, join hands in V-pos, face ctr.

Styling: Bouncy and light.

4 meas <u>INTRODUCTION</u>: Drum solo.

I. FIGURE I

- 1 Touch L heel fwd to the floor (ct 1); step on L beside R (ct 2).
- Touch R toe behind to the floor (ct 1); step on R beside L (ct 2).
- 3 Step on R to R (ct 1); step on L beside R (ct 2).
- 4 Step on R to R (ct 1); bring L beside R (no wt) (ct 2).
- 5-7 Repeat meas 1-3.
- Ft in closed pos, bend knees and make a full turn with the knees CCW (ct 1); jump on both feet

(closed pos) (ct 2).
